

MOTORSPORT NEW ZEALAND INC

Hearing before a Subcommittee of the Executive Committee of MotorSport New Zealand held by correspondence.

In the matter of an Executive Inquiry into the driving of a competition vehicle at an event without completion of documentation at Pukekohe on 26 July 2007.

The Executive sub-committee finds

1. All parties concerned agreed that the matter would be handled by correspondence.
2. Documents from John De Vere-Ellery, Clerk of the Course and Glen Lawton- competition licence #14987 were considered
3. A sports car entered by Kevin Hunt (licence #15437) was on the dummy grid with two people in it. No permission to take passengers have been given. The passenger was removed from the car and it continued on the warm up lap.
4. The passenger was identified as Kevin Hunt.
5. The car was removed from the track prior to the start of the event and was identified as Glen Lawton.
6. Mr Lawton was not entered for the event but because he had a similar vehicle, he was making a comparison of both vehicles. This was being undertaken with Mr Hunt's consent.
7. The Clerk of the Course subsequently penalised Mr Hunt using Penalty NSC4 - \$250 fine.
8. Mr Lawton's participation in the event is contrary to NSC 35 (b).


The Executive sub-committee rules:
