Why?

- To minimise the risk of transmission, and be able to track and isolate any outbreak
- Let's not go backwards we all win if we move forward playing it safe to ensure we can all experience the benefits of play, active recreation and sport

Playing it Safe in recreation and sport means

- If you're sick stay home and get tested
- Know who's there, or be able to find them (contact tracing)
- play, active

 Neep it small and as local as possible (gathering sizes)
 - Keep our distance (physical distancing)
 - Keep it clean (equipment and surfaces) and keep ourselves clean (personal hygiene)
 - Start slow, and only progress when everybody is prepared Prepare before Play
 - Test your plans and processes check and re-check
 - Understand the spirit of the guidelines and apply it
 - Keep within your skill level
 - Be kind

This quick reference guide is designed to help organisations and individuals meet the Government requirements that allow us to resume play, active recreation and sport activities safely under COVID-19 Alert Level 2.

The questions below will assist any activity organiser or individual to determine whether their activity can proceed.

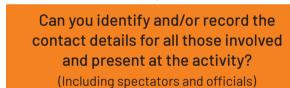

- The limit for gatherings is 10 people including participants, coaches, officials and support
- · More than one gathering can operate (indoors and outdoors) where 2m physical distancing can be maintained between all groups and spectators at all times
- More than 10 people can participate in an activity as long as they can maintain 2m physical distancing, and all other public health and safety requirements are in place
