Preamble

Motorsport New Zealand Inc hereby declares the following articles to be those governing Competitors in the GT New Zealand Race Championship.

These articles are at all times to be read in conjunction with:

- The National Sporting Code (NSC) and its appropriate Appendices and Schedules, specifically Appendix Four, Schedule Z – Races
- The Technical Regulations – Schedule GT
- The Event Supplementary Regulations issued by the Inviting Clubs.

1. INTERPRETATIONS:

In these Articles, the definition of terms used within this Schedule shall be referenced from the National Sporting Code, and as detailed below:

“**CPS**” means Compulsory Pit Stop, and

“**The Championship**” means the GT New Zealand Championship for vehicles complying with Schedule GT New Zealand Championship Technical regulations; and

“**Round Organiser**” or “**Inviting Club**” means the MotorSport NZ Member Club organising a Meeting and/or Event which is a round of the Championship; and

“**Round**” means each Meeting and / or Event - the results of which qualify for points in the Championship.

2. ELIGIBILITY:

2.1 DRIVER ELIGIBILITY:

2.1.1 All Drivers shall hold a C1 Grade Competition Licence or higher and if the Entrant is other than one of the registered Drivers, an Entrant’s Licence is required in the name of the Entrant.

Note: *Under the provisions of the Trans-Tasman Visa Agreement between Motorsport Australia and MotorSport New Zealand Inc, Australian Competitors holding both Motorsport Australia Circuit Competition Licences and Trans-Tasman Visas may enter any of the New Zealand Race Championships and be eligible for awards.*

2.1.2 Foreign participants may compete in the Championship in accordance with Appendix One, Schedule L, Article 6.1.

2.1.3 All drivers and entrants must be financial members of an affiliated MotorSport NZ Club, with the exception of those competing on a Trans-Tasman Visa, or Foreign Participation Visa.

2.1.4 No elite-drivers are permitted to compete in the Championship. An elite-driver is based on the shared list maintained by the North Island Endurance Racing Drivers Club, and South Island Endurance Racing Drivers Club.

2.1.5 Driving Team: Each entry may consist of up to two(2) drivers.

2.1.6 One of the registered Drivers or Entrant for each Vehicle must hold a GT New Zealand Championship Racing Entitlement Licence, applied for via the Championship Coordinator.

2.2 VEHICLE ELIGIBILITY:

2.2.1 Eligibility shall be for vehicles complying with Schedule GT.

2.2.2 All Competitors shall agree to submit their vehicle for eligibility and/or safety scrutineering inspections as and when required by the appointed Championship Scrutineer, and/or a MotorSport NZ licensed Technical Officer. Any costs incurred during disassembly of components shall be met and accepted by the Competitor.

2.3 CLASSES: There are two classes as follows and as noted in Schedule GT New Zealand Championship:

(1) **OPEN:** being those vehicles eligible as listed in Article 2.1.1 of Schedule GT.

(2) **GT4:** being those vehicles eligible as listed in Article 2.1.2 of Schedule GT.

2.4 All competing vehicles shall reserve the spaces for the Championship sponsors' and official Championship decals at all Rounds, of which will be provided by the Championship.

All competitors shall carry competition numbers and competitor's name in the locations and to the dimensions set out in Appendix One to these Articles.

Note: *The Championship Coordinator may permit variation of decal location for individual vehicles upon application.*

3. CHAMPIONSHIP PERSONNEL:

3.1 At each Round of the Championship the following personnel shall have the responsibilities and authorities as set out below.

3.1.1 The appointed Championship personnel may have deputies and assistants to whom they may delegate any of their responsibilities and authorities by way of Bulletin posted on the Official Notice Board at each Round.

Who shall have the duties and authority of a Championship Coordinator as set out in the National Sporting Code and who is responsible for and authorised on the Championships behalf to:

- (a) Deal with all administrative matters pertaining to the Championship, and
- (b) Record and publish all Championship points schedules, and
- (c) Liaise with Inviting Club/s on all matters pertaining to these Articles, and
- (d) Ensure correct placement of decals on vehicles contesting the Championship, and

- (e) Provide and/or assist the Inviting Club/s with grid starting positions in accordance with Article 6.4 of these Articles, and
- (f) Calculate and publish CPS times, and
- (g) Attend Steward's meeting if requested.

- (a) Ensuring compliance with MotorSport NZ National Sporting Code and its addendums, and this Schedule.
- (b) Undertaking duties and authorities outlined in NSC 78 & 79.
- (c) Conducting Race Director briefing sessions.
- (d) Liaising with the Championship Promoter regarding promotional activities.
- (e) Conducting any inquiries necessary (including any hearings and inquiries held outside of Rounds of the Championship) to resolve any issues and imposing any penalties arising therefrom that may arise during the conduct of the Championship.
- (f) Judge of Fact (Starts)
- (g) Judge of Fact (Yellow Flag redressing)

Who shall have the authority of a **Series Scrutineer** set out in the National Sporting Code and who is responsible for and authorised on the Championship's behalf to:

- (a) Deal with all technical matters pertaining to the Championship; and
- (b) Affix official seals, and conduct tyre marking, as and when deemed appropriate; and
- (c) Inspect any competing vehicle within the Championship in order to ascertain compliance with the technical and eligibility regulations; and
- (d) Assist competitors with technical enquiries relative to the technical regulations applicable to their vehicle; and
- (e) Undertake the duties of a Technical Judge (NSC 86(d)) with respect to weights and measures; and
- (f) Liaise with event Officials and Championship Coordinator on any scrutineering or technical conformity issue for the category; and
- (g) To report, to the Race Director, any instances where a breach of the technical regulations has been identified.

4. CHAMPIONSHIP ENTRY:

4.1 Entry into the Championship shall be made via email through the Championship Coordinator in the form of an **annual** series exclusive GT New Zealand Championship Racing Entitlement Licence.

4.1.1 For two-driver teams, one of the registered Drivers or Entrant for each Vehicle must hold a GT New Zealand Championship **Annual** Series Racing Entitlement Licence, applied for via the Championship Coordinator.

4.1.2 The **annual** series exclusive GT New Zealand Championship Racing Entitlement Licence of \$5,000 plus GST is payable to secure entry into the Championship. Any entry will not be deemed valid until payment is received.

4.1.3 The Championship **Coordinator** reserves the right to accept or decline entries into the Championship as per NSC 21.

4.2 In entering the Championship, all Drivers / Entrants:

- (1) Are deemed to be in acceptance of these Articles as they are presented, and
- (2) Agree to comply with these Articles and those of the National Sporting Code, and
- (3) Shall be at all times responsible for the presentation of their competing vehicle with respect to safety requirements under Schedule A, and eligibility requirements under these Championship Articles, and
- (4) Shall comply with any specific requirements of the official Championship Sponsor(s), as detailed within these Championship Articles.

4.3 Entry to each Round of the Championship (which is separate to the Championship Entry)

should be made via email through the Championship Coordinator.

- 4.3.1** Entry fees per Round per vehicle will be \$4,000 plus GST per round, or \$15,000 plus GST if committing to all five Rounds in the Championship and payment received prior to the commencement of the Championship. Any entry will not be deemed valid until payment is received.

These fees include Friday Practice, relevant levies, TV coverage, pit marquee or garage, VIP drivers lounge and VIP hospitality for three people.

- 4.4** There will be no refunds given once an entry has been processed. Credits against future competition will be considered in exceptional circumstances.
- 4.5** Competition numbers are to be allocated by the Series Coordinator, while the Competitor shall provide the physical competition number sets.

5. CHAMPIONSHIP STRUCTURE:

- 5.1** The Championship shall comprise the following Rounds:

- 5.2** The Organiser reserves the right to either cancel or amend any Rounds of the Championship due to force majeure without affecting in any way its power to award any title.

6. CHAMPIONSHIP FORMAT:

- 6.1 Practice:** For all Rounds there will be a minimum of two(2) practice sessions of thirty(30) minutes duration. The Driver(s) may only use their competition vehicle which they have entered in the Round in these sessions.

- 6.2 Qualifying:** Each Class will have one (1) Qualifying session with a minimum duration of fifteen (15) minutes. There will be a scheduled break of at least five (5) minutes between each Qualifying session.

- 6.3 Races:** There shall be three(3) races at each round; two thirty minute races, and one sixty minute race. The order of these races will be advised in the event schedule for each Round.

- 6.3.1** Where an entry consists of two(2) drivers:

- (1) Unless specifically permitted by the Race Director, both drivers shall participate in either the Practice or the Qualifying session.
- (2) Either Driver can start Race One, regardless of who participated in Qualifying.
- (3) Each Driver must individually compete in one of the thirty-minute Races, and
- (4) Both must compete in the sixty-minute race.

6.4 Races: shall be run to the following race structure:

- (1) **Race One:** Starting positions will be determined by the fastest lap times achieved from Qualifying Session with the fastest Competitor to the front.
- (2) **Race Two:** Starting Positions for Race Two will be determined by the finishing positions from Race One.
- (3) **Race Three:** Starting Positions will be determined by the combined Race Points gained by the driver(s) in Races One and Two at that Round, with the highest scoring driver to the front. In the case of equal Race Points at that Round, the fastest lap recorded by the tied competitors in either qualifying, Race One or Race Two will be used to allocate the higher position. In the instance of an outstanding inquiry or protest 60 minutes prior to the expected race start, the provisional results will be used to calculate points.

6.5 Race Starting Procedures: At all Rounds, all Races will be a Rolling Start as follows:

- (1) When instructed by an official, each Vehicle will leave pit lane for one(1) positioning lap to the grid. Drivers must not stop to carry out a practice start during this lap including when leaving Pit Exit. When a Vehicle arrives at the grid it must stop in its allocated position.
- (2) When the pole vehicle is in place, a warning will be sounded and a “2 Minute” board displayed by the Starter. Pit Lane exit will be closed at this time.
- (3) When 1 minute remains before the formation laps, a warning will be sounded and a “1 Minute” board displayed by the Starter.
- (4) Any Vehicle not having reached the pit entry by the “1 minute” signal must enter the Pit Lane from where they may start the race under the direction of an official after the field has passed.
- (5) When 30 seconds remain before the formation laps, a warning will be sounded and a “30 Second” board will be displayed by the Starter.
- (6) When the green signal is displayed by the Starter, each Vehicle may then proceed on to two formation laps. The field will be picked up by the Safety Car on the second lap.
- (7) Schedule Z 8.4 (2) and (3) shall then apply.

6.6 At all Rounds, the Championship Coordinator in conjunction with the Race Director(s) and/or the Stewards of the Meeting, reserves the right to shorten and / or cancel any practice / qualifying sessions and / or Races in the case of Force Majeure.

6.7 Meeting Rides may be run as advised in the Event Supplementary Regulations and shall be conducted in accordance with the MotorSport NZ Meeting Ride Policy

7. BALANCE OF PERFORMANCE COMPULSORY PIT STOP

7.1 During all races there will be a Balance of Performance Compulsory Pit Stop (CPS), the duration of which will be determined by the Championship Coordinator.

7.1.2 Drivers will be notified of their Compulsory Pit Stop duration no later than thirty(30) minutes prior to the start of the race.

7.1.3 The CPS may NOT be carried out under Safety Car conditions. Any vehicle that has already entered pit lane at the time the Safety Car is deployed may still complete their CPS.

7.1.4 Should a driver be prevented from taking the CPS due to either:

(a) A Safety Car period, or

(b) The Race is concluded in accordance with Schedule Z 9.2 (3) or Championship Article 6.6.

then Penalty A2.38(4) shall be applied.

7.2 Thirty Minute Races:

(a) The CPS shall take place between ten(10) minutes and twenty(20) minutes from the start of the race and shall commence when the Vehicle comes to a complete stop outside their pit bay.

(b) The driver must remain in the vehicle with their safety harness fully fastened.

(c) Should the Safety Car be deployed during the CPS window, the Race Director may extend the CPS window.

7.3 Sixty Minute Race:

(a) The CPS shall take place between twenty(20) and forty(40) minutes from the start of the race and shall commence when the Vehicle comes to a complete stop outside their pit bay.

(b) Where there is one(1) Driver entered, the driver must remain in the vehicle with their safety harness fully fastened.

(c) Where there are two(2) Drivers entered, a driver change shall take place during the CPS.

(d) The Vehicle may not leave after the CPS until the driver's safety harness has been fully refastened.

(e) Should the Safety Car be deployed during the CPS window, the Race Director may extend the CPS window.

7.4 Each driver is responsible for determining how their timed CPS is managed.

7.5 In the event of a dispute or an inquiry into a competitor complying with the stipulated stationary-time, the vehicle's camera recording may be used to determine the length of the stop.

7.6 The only permitted intervention with the vehicle during the timed CPS will be:

- (i) a Driver change (if applicable) in accordance with Article 7.3(c).
- (ii) rolling the car back and forwards no more than 2 metres (the vehicle cannot be moved ahead of the point at which it stopped for the Pit Stop) to disperse brake heat. Tyre pressures may be checked and adjusted, and external cooling fans can also be used to disperse heat from the radiators and brakes. Drink bottles may be topped up or changed.
- (iii) **Sixty-minute race only:** in addition to 7.6 (i) and (ii), changing tyres will be permitted.

7.6.1 Any other intervention with the vehicle can only occur when the CPS is complete.

7.7 There shall be no refueling of the vehicle during the race.

8. PARC FERMÉ:

8.1 Upon directive from the Championship Scrutineer or their appointed assistant, Competitors may be required to drive their competing vehicle directly (and without any team personnel / crew intervention) from the track to the designated Parc Fermé, the location of which will be notified on the official notice board of the Meeting.

Note: *Drivers should ensure that they and all their team personnel are familiar with the Parc Fermé regulations and limitations as detailed in the National Sporting Code Article 60.*

8.2 The Championship Scrutineer may authorise the entry of team personnel for the purposes of vehicle eligibility inspections.

8.3 Unless the Championship Scrutineer consents in each case, any car unable to proceed to Parc Fermé under its own power must nevertheless be delivered there as soon as practicable.

9. RACE RADIO

9.1 Race Radio is compulsory and will be used for all major announcements, including race penalties and to communicate with team managers and drivers concerning incidents and circuit penalties.

9.2 The frequency is 489.681250 colour code 10 Digital.

9.2.1 Any race radio tuned to the above frequency must be set to “receive” only.

9.3 Any announcement over Race Radio will be considered as having been heard and understood by teams and drivers. These announcements are decisions and are binding and will be additional to flag/light signals to drivers.

10. PENALTIES

10.1 Penalties shall be applied in accordance with the prescribed articles of NSC Part VIII – Penalties, Schedule P, and Appendix Two to these articles.

10.2 **Championship Demerit Points:** These penalty points are deemed to be additional to any Time Penalty or Drive Through Penalty that may have been imposed. These points are cumulative over all **Rounds of the Championship Series**. Grid or race exclusion requirements will be imposed once the grid for a race has been determined.

- (1) **6 points:** Go back six(6) grid places for next race.
- (2) **10 points:** start from rear of grid for the next race.
- (3) **15 points:** exclusion from next race and start from rear of grid at following race.
- (4) **19 points:** exclusion from two (2) races and endorsement of competition Licence until 30 June 2024.

Note: *The 'next race' is clarified as being the race a Competitor is starting following a decision being delivered.*

10.3 Competitor clearance: If Competitors are required for inquiries or hearings, they will be advised by summons or notice, as applicable. Additionally, an announcement may be made on race radio. These notifications will be made within one(1) hour following completion of the category's final race for the day/Meeting. No Competitor may leave the Circuit until one(1) hour after the finish of their last race on the day.

- (1) Any Competitor so notified must receive clearance from the Race Director or Chairman of Stewards prior to leaving the Circuit.
- (2) Any Competitor who lodges a protest into any matter must receive clearance from the Chairman of Stewards prior to leaving the Circuit.
- (3) Subsequent non-attendance of a Competitor will not stop any hearing proceeding and a decision being taken. It is the responsibility of the relevant official or Competitor to ensure their witnesses are available and able to take part in the hearing.

10.4 Stewards extended powers:

- (1) The Stewards shall have extended powers to deal with any matters that arise in relation to the Championship between Meetings. A Stewards' panel may be convened by MotorSport NZ at any time during the Series to consider any protest or other matter within their jurisdiction in relation to the Championship which may be referred to them, or which may be initiated by the Stewards on their own volition.
- (2) When the Stewards have commenced a hearing at one place, and it is deemed by them not practicable to complete consideration of that matter at that time and place, the hearing may be adjourned to another time and place and may be heard by a panel of Stewards other than those who commenced the hearing, provided at least one(1) Steward who was at the original hearing is a member of the new panel. If required, the panel will be appointed by MotorSport NZ.
- (3) The Stewards may call upon any witness or advisor they so decide, either as part of, or outside, a hearing to assist in resolution of any matter.
- (4) The Stewards maximum fine level is raised to \$10,000 for any offence. Additionally, they may, for any offence, impose the penalty of exclusion from the Meeting or Event and endorse a Competition Licence for a maximum period of twelve (12) months.
 - (i) If at the conclusion of a hearing the Stewards consider that the matter has been proven and the penalty prescribed in Appendix Two is insufficient given the serious nature of the offence then in such instances the matter may be passed to MotorSport New Zealand for action.

11. TYRE TYPE, ALLOCATION AND MARKING PROCEDURES:

11.1 Only the control tyre (dry and wet specification) as per Schedule GT, Article 11 are permitted for use at any Round of the Championship.

11.1.1 The control tyres must be purchased from the approved provider who will also provide trackside support and fitting services.

11.1.2 Only dry control tyres that have been specifically marked for the current Championship may be used. The tyres will be marked for use on a specified competition vehicle and must be fitted to the wheel in accordance with the manufacturer's specifications. This includes **direction and asymmetry**. If the tyre supplier doesn't have the specification or tyre size available, they can introduce another option in correspondence with the Championship organisers.

Note: *It is not a requirement to have the control wet tyres marked.*

11.1.3 In the event of wet or damp conditions at the start of or during a Practice, Qualifying session or race, at the discretion of the Competitor(s), it is permitted to use wet specification tyres. **The vehicle's rain light must be illuminated.**

11.2 New "Dry" tyre allocation: The maximum number of new dry tyres at each round is eight(8) PLUS any previously marked control tyres from the current championship except for Round One where **fourteen (14)** new controlled tyres can be used and presented for marking. No previously marked tyres can be used or presented for marking at Round One.

11.2.1 If a dry tyre is damaged, the Championship **Scrutineer**, in consultation with the **approved provider's** representative, shall determine the suitability of any (dry) replacement control tyre that has not been marked for the current Championship.

11.3 "Wet" Tyre allocation per Round: There is no controlled allocation of wet tyres per Round. If the meeting is declared "wet" by the Race Director only "wet" specification tyres must be used.

11.4 Tyre marking: Tyre marking (**tyre bar code reading**) will take place outside the competitors pit garage at each round **one** hour prior to Qualifying except at round one entered where tyre marking will be **two** hours prior to practice one and will be under the supervision of the Championship **Scrutineer**. Any change in time for this will be advised by the Championship Coordinator. It is the responsibility of the competitor to have their tyres ready and clean for marking by this time.

11.4.1 It is the Competitor's responsibility to ensure that tyre markings remain clearly visible. Whenever a tyre marking starts to become illegible, the Competitor must advise the Championship **Scrutineer** accordingly, who will decide upon the appropriate course of action.

11.5 It is the responsibility of the competitor to keep a record of all tyres used in the championship by bar code and the meeting where they were used. This list must be made available to championship officials on request.

(1) In all instances, Tyre Marking references a unique identifier in the form of either a physical Tyre Marking or the scanning of the Tyres Bar Code or both.

11.6 Tyre use during Practice:

- (1) **Round One:** The only tyres that are permitted to be used are tyres that are marked In accordance with Article 11.2 and 11.4.
- (2) **Rounds Two, Three, Four and Five:** Any eligible tyre as outlined in Schedule GT may be used during practice, and do not require marking.

11.7 The use of any tyre heating, heat retention device or chemical treatment is prohibited.

12. IN-CAR JUDICIAL CAMERAS

12.1 All GT New Zealand Championship vehicles will be required to carry an approved in-vehicle camera, which shall be supplied by the competitor. The position of fitting this camera takes precedence over any other camera fitted in the vehicle.

12.2 This camera must be mounted in accordance with Schedule A, Part One Article 6.4 and must be forward facing to capture both the steering wheel and the front view from the front windscreen.

12.3 It is the Competitors responsibility to ensure the camera is switched on and recording during all Practice, Qualifying and Race Sessions. For cameras not recording, a Penalty will be applied.

12.4 Any on-board camera footage and information recorded shall be made available to Championship Officials upon request. Such recordings shall be retained and unmodified in any way for a minimum of fourteen(14) days after the conclusion of the event.

12.5 All rights to all camera footage remains the property of the Championship at all times.

12.6 **Access to Television Outside Broadcast Facility and footage:** No Entrant, Driver or team member shall be permitted to access the television 'Outside Broadcasting' facility or gain access to any footage directly from the broadcaster during an Event, without obtaining the express permission of the Race Director(s) or the Chairman of Stewarding Panel.

13. POINTS:

13.1 Points will be allocated to Drivers in the Vehicle as follows:

13.1.1 Where an entry consists of one(1) Driver, points will be allocated based on their highest finishing position in Race One, Race Two and Race Three.

13.1.2 Where an entry consists of two(2) Drivers, points will be allocated based on the finishing position of the car in each Race irrespective of which driver was driving the car.

13.2 There will be points awarded for Qualifying in each class:

13.3.1 Points allocations will be increased by 50% for the sixty-minute race.

14. AWARDS:

14.1 The Class Championship winners for Class Open and Class GT4 shall be the Driver with the highest Class points score awarded from all Rounds of the Championship.

14.2 The presentation of Championship Awards shall be made at the conclusion of the Championship at the Motorsport New Zealand Annual Awards Function.

14.3 Each class will be awarded 1st, 2nd and 3rd overall according to the results of the Championship.

15. PIT SPACE ALLOCATION:

15.1 A marquee or pit garage where available will be allocated by the Championship Coordinator to each Competitor. The Championship Coordinator will issue a notice regarding the terms and conditions of use of all marquees and/or pit garages prior to the commencement of the Championship.

15.1.1 The Championship Coordinator will allocate an area in pit lane for each competitor when they are not in a pit garage.

15.2 Except when required as part of the programme, or for approved technical reasons, Competitors are to have their competition vehicles in this area, for each Round from:

(a) **Saturday:** 9am - 5pm

(b) **Sunday:** 9am until one(1) hour after conclusion of GT New Zealand Championship's last race.

15.2.1 The front entrance of the marquee or pit garage must be open during these times with the front of the vehicle facing the front opening, except when a vehicle is involved in a track session.
