

ARTICLES GOVERNING THE 2025-26 Bridgestone GR86 Championship

Preamble

MotorSport New Zealand Inc hereby declares the following articles to be those governing competition for drivers in the MotorSport NZ Bridgestone GR86 Championship.

These articles are at all times to be read in conjunction with:

- The National Sporting Code (NSC), its appropriate Appendices and Schedule, specifically Schedule Z being the Standing Regulations applicable to all Races;
- The Technical Regulations (2025-26 Schedule GR86); and
- The Event Supplementary Regulations, and Race Director's written briefing

A Sanctioning Permit Number of 259087 has been issued in the name of MotorSport New Zealand.

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OFFICIAL RECORD OF AMENDMENTS ISSUED TO THESE ARTICLES

MotorSport New Zealand may issue amendments to these Championship Articles or Technical Schedule where it is deemed necessary to amend or clarify any article. These amendments will be issued by the Chief Executive Officer or their representative in the form of Championship Amendments.

1. INTERPRETATIONS

In these Articles the following expressions shall have the meanings set out:

“**Car**” or “**GR86 Racecar**” means a GR86 car, originally supplied by Toyota New Zealand, built to the specifications of 2025-26 Schedule GR86; and

“**Category Manager**” means TOYOTA GAZOO Racing NZ who have provided the Technical Regulations (Schedule GR86) and organised the class; and

The “**Championship**” means the MotorSport NZ GR86 Championship for cars complying with Schedule GR86; and

“**Inviting Clubs**” means the MotorSport NZ Clubs hosting Rounds of the Championship; and

“**New tyre**” means a tyre supplied by the official service provider with identification that has not been through a heat cycle and exhibits no wear; and

“**Registered tyre**” means a tyre (used or new) that at an event in the current championship season has been submitted to the GR86 Championship Scrutineer(s) for recording and marking/scanning for that vehicle; and

“**Round**” means from the first practice session to the end of the last race at each race meeting at which drivers may score points towards the Championship; and

“**Set of tyres**” means two front tyres and two rear tyres; and

“**Supplementary tyre**” means a tyre (either new or registered) selected solely at the discretion of the GR86 Championship Scrutineer to replace one or more of a competitor’s tyres at a Round; and

“TOYOTA GAZOO Racing NZ” or “TGRNZ” means representatives appointed by Toyota New Zealand Ltd as the “Category Manager” to organise the class; and

“Used tyre” means a tyre that has been through a heat cycle and exhibits wear.

2. ELIGIBILITY

2.1 DRIVER ELIGIBILITY:

- 2.1.1** All drivers shall hold a C1 Grade Competition Licence or higher and if the Entrant is other than the driver, an Entrant’s Licence is required in the name of the entrant.

Note: Under the provisions of the Trans-Tasman Visa Agreement between Motorsport Australia and MotorSport New Zealand Inc, Australian Competitors holding both Motorsport Australia Circuit Competition Licences and Trans-Tasman Visas may enter any of the New Zealand Race Championships and be eligible for awards.

- 2.1.2** Foreign participants may compete in the Championship in accordance with Appendix One, Schedule L, Article 6.1.
- 2.1.3** All drivers and entrants must be financial members of an affiliated MotorSport New Zealand Club, with the exception of those competing on a Trans-Tasman Visa, or Foreign Participation Visa.

2.2 VEHICLE ELIGIBILITY:

- 2.2.1** Eligibility shall be for GR86 cars complying with the specifications set out in Schedule GR86.

- 2.2.2** All entrants and drivers shall agree to submit their vehicle for eligibility scrutineering when required by the Championship Scrutineer and/or MotorSport NZ Technical Officers and for compliance to Appendix Two, Schedule A and Appendix Four of the National Sporting Code.

- 2.2.3 Vehicle Decals:** Competitors will be provided with Category and Sponsor decals which must be displayed in the prescribed positions in accordance with Appendix One to these articles.

- (1)** Any competitor who fails to properly display legible decals or replace spoiled or damaged decals will be prevented from entering the track for meeting rides, practice, qualifying or racing and may be excluded from further participation in the Category plus a penalty maybe issued.
- (2)** No vehicle, driver or entrant will be permitted to display any advertising whatsoever pertaining to a motor vehicle manufacturer other than Toyota or Toyota Corporation Group companies without the express written permission of TOYOTA GAZOO Racing New Zealand.
- (3)** All competitor advertising (i.e. names, trademarks or logos) and shall be displayed on the car in a professional manner.

2.2.4 Permanent Race Numbers:

- (1)** Competitors are reminded to contact the Championship Coordinator to reserve a race number for the season.
- (2)** All Competitors must apply for a race number each season and cannot assume that the previous season’s number is automatically retained.

- 2.2.5** Cars must be in conformity with Schedule GR86 and decal placements during all Practice, Qualifying and Race sessions.

3. CHAMPIONSHIP PERSONNEL

Who is appointed and authorised by MotorSport New Zealand to be responsible for:

- (a) Ensuring compliance with MotorSport New Zealand National Sporting Code (NSC), its addendums and this schedule;
- (b) Undertaking duties and authorities outlined in NSC 78 & 79;
- (c) Conducting Race Director briefing sessions;
- (d) Liaising with the Approved Promoter regarding promotional activities;
- (e) Conducting any inquiries necessary (including any hearings and inquiries held outside of Rounds of the Championship) to resolve any issues and imposing any penalties arising therefrom that may arise during the conduct of the Championship;
- (f) Starting Judge; and
- (g) Judge of Fact (Yellow Flag redressing).

Who is responsible for and authorised by MotorSport New Zealand to:

- (a) Organise the Category;
- (b) Liaise with Inviting Clubs and MotorSport New Zealand on matters pertaining to the Category;
- (c) Ensure supply and correct placement of competition number sets and correct placement of decals on competing vehicles;
- (d) Ensure Event award winners attend presentations;
- (e) Liaise with Event Officials on any sporting aspect for the category; and
- (f) Maintain list of Unsupported Inquiries (see Article 10).

- (a) Establish the GR86 technical eligibility audit programme at the Event;
- (b) Undertake Safety Audits including management of vehicle logbooks, tyre allocation and marking;
- (c) Impound and affix seals as required;
- (d) Undertake technical eligibility checking;
- (e) Undertake the duties of a Technical Judge (NSC 86(1)(d)) with respect to weights and measures;
- (f) Undertake the duties of a Tyre Judge (NSC 86(1)(f));
- (g) Liaise with event Officials and the Championship Coordinator on any scrutineering or technical conformity issue for the category; and
- (h) Report to the Race Director at the Event with their proposed technical checking programme and subsequent results prior to the final Stewards meeting.

Who is authorised by MotorSport New Zealand to undertake the duties outlined in Appendix Four, Schedule Z, Article 22.

4. CHAMPIONSHIP REGISTRATION/ROUND ENTRY

4.1 Registration into the Championship should be made through the Championship Coordinator (amanda.tollemache@toyota.co.nz).

- 4.2** In submitting a registration into the Championship, all Entrants and Drivers:
- (1) Are deemed to be in acceptance of these Championship Articles as they are presented;
 - (2) Agree to comply with these Articles, and those of the National Sporting Code;
 - (3) Shall be at all times responsible for the presentation of their competing vehicle with respect to safety requirements under Schedule A, eligibility requirements under these Championship Articles and Schedule GR86; and
 - (4) Shall comply with any specific requirements of the official Series Sponsor(s), as detailed within these Championship Articles.

4.3 Round Entry: entry to each Round shall be made through the Championship Coordinator.

4.3.1 Entry Fees: These fees include Friday Practice and MotorSport New Zealand levies.

- (a) **The entry fees will be \$3,000** (GST inclusive) for each Round.
- (b) **Total Round Entry Fees Incentive season registration** completed by 26 September 2025 and payment made by 10 October 2025 are \$14,000 (GST inclusive) and are non-refundable.

5. CHAMPIONSHIP STRUCTURE

5.1 The Championship will comprise the following Rounds:

5.1.1 MotorSport New Zealand reserves the right to either cancel or amend any Rounds of the Championship due to force majeure without affecting in any way its powers to award any title.

6. CHAMPIONSHIP FORMAT

6.1 Prior to the start of the Championship, there shall be a Media Test-Day that all Drivers must attend with their vehicle. It's recommended that vehicles are presented in compliance with Schedule GR86.

6.2 Testing Limitations:

No testing of a GR86 Racecar will be permitted on the circuit at which the Round is scheduled to be held Monday to Thursday (inclusive) in the week of that Round, except any test sessions organised by TGRNZ.

All competitors have an allowance of 1500kms of testing as recorded by the MoTeC ECU. The 1500km restriction comes into force from 30 September 2025 and ends 13 April 2026. The restriction relates to the car, so regardless of the driver and tyre brand, the car itself is limited to 1500km of testing, which will be monitored throughout the 2025-26 season by TGRNZ.

6.3 Briefings: The Race Director may hold a category briefing, team manager and competitors briefing session at each Round.

(a) The time of each Meeting will be contained in the meeting Supplementary Regulations or notified on the Official Notice Board.

(b) Attendance on time by all drivers and team managers is compulsory.

6.4 Practice: Practice sessions will be available at each Round of the Championship. The Driver may only use their competition vehicle which they have entered in the Round in those sessions. No other on-track opportunities will be available once the Meeting commences on Friday unless permission is obtained from the Race Director.

6.5 Qualifying: At all Rounds there will be a Qualifying session of twenty(20) minutes in duration.

(1) In the instance of a Red signal during this session, the Race Director may add up to an additional ten(10) minutes to the session. Should the red signal be displayed with less than two minutes remaining in the session, the session may not be restarted.

- (2) For the duration of Qualifying all vehicles not on the circuit are to remain on the Pit Lane Apron and shall not enter the Pit garages. No refuelling is permitted during the Qualifying session.
- (3) For the duration of Qualifying the only permitted changes to the car are adjustment of tyre pressures and damper settings.

6.6 Race Distances:

- 6.6.1** At all Rounds the Race Director, in consultation with the Clerk of the Course and the Stewards following consultation with the Championship Coordinator (where practicable), reserves the right to shorten and/or cancel races in the case of Force Majeure.
- 6.7 Starting Positions:** At all Rounds, all Races will be standing starts in accordance with the provisions of Schedule Z.
- (1) **Starting Positions for Race One** will be determined by the second fastest lap time achieved in the Qualifying session, fastest driver to the front.
 - (2) **Starting Positions for Race Two** will be determined by the finishing positions from Race One, with the top 50% of the field reversed, up to a maximum of 10 grid positions.
 - (3) **Starting Positions for Race Three** will be determined by the fastest lap time achieved in the Qualifying session, fastest driver to the front.
- 6.8** Meeting Rides may be run as advised in the Event Supplementary Regulations and shall be conducted in accordance with the MotorSport New Zealand Meeting Ride Policy
- 6.8.1** This session is for promotional purposes only, and not for driver instruction, car set up, or technical adjustments of any nature. No team member, team manager, or other Competitors at the Meeting is permitted to be taken as a passenger.

7. PARC FERME

- 7.1** At the conclusion of any Qualifying session or Race, Drivers, upon directive from either the Championship Scrutineer or a MotorSport New Zealand Technical Officer, may be required to drive their competing car directly (without any pit crew intervention at all) from the track to the designated Parc Fermé.

Note: Drivers should ensure that they and all their team personnel are familiar with the Parc Fermé regulations and limitations as detailed in the National Sporting Code Article 60.

- 7.2** Whilst the car is Parc Ferme the following is permitted:

- (1) The bonnet of the vehicle is allowed to be opened to allow the engine to cool.
- (2) One(1) mechanic may take tyre pressure readings only. No pressure adjustment is allowed.
- (3) One(1) engineer may download dash data only.

No other intervention is permitted unless specifically authorised by the Championship Scrutineer, or Race Director.

8. RACE RADIO

- 8.1** Race Radio is compulsory and will be used for all major announcements, including race penalties and to communicate with team managers and drivers concerning incidents and circuit penalties.
- 8.2** The frequency is 489.681250 Colour Code 10 Digital.
- 8.2.1** Any race radio tuned to the above frequency must be set to “receive” only.
- 8.3** Any announcement over Race Radio will be considered as having been heard and understood by teams and drivers. These announcements are decisions and are binding and will be additional to flag/light signals to drivers.

9. PENALTIES

- 9.1** Penalties shall be applied in accordance with the prescribed articles of NSC Part VIII – Penalties, Schedule P, and Appendix Two to these articles.
- 9.2** **Reverse grids:** If a Competitor receives any penalty during a Meeting that will give a positive effect for a reverse grid start then they will be placed at the rear of the reversed section of the grid. This supersedes Schedule Z, Article 6.6.
- 9.3** **Championship Demerit Points:** These penalty points are deemed to be additional to any Time Penalty or Drive Through Penalty that may have been imposed. These points are cumulative over all **Rounds of the Championship Series**. Grid or race exclusion requirements will be imposed once the grid for a race has been determined.
- (1) 6 points:** Go back six(6) grid places for next race.
 - (2) 10 points:** start from rear of grid for the next race.
 - (3) 15 points:** exclusion from next race and start from rear of grid at following race.
 - (4) 19 points:** exclusion from two(2) races and endorsement of competition Licence until 30 June 2026.

Note: The ‘next race’ is clarified as being the race a Competitor is starting following a decision being delivered.

- 9.4** **Competitor clearance:** If Competitors are required for inquiries or hearings, they will be advised by summons or notice, as applicable. Additionally, an announcement may be made on race radio. These notifications will be made within one(1) hour following completion of the category’s final race for the day/Meeting. No Competitor may leave the Circuit until one(1) hour after the finish of their last race on the day.
- (1)** Any Competitor so notified must receive clearance from the Race Director or Chairman of Stewards prior to leaving the Circuit.
 - (2)** Any Competitor who lodges an inquiry into any matter must receive clearance from the Race Director prior to leaving the Circuit.
 - (3)** Any Competitor who lodges a protest into any matter must receive clearance from the Chairman of Stewards prior to leaving the Circuit.

- (4) Subsequent non-attendance of a Competitor will not stop any hearing proceeding and a decision being taken. It is the responsibility of the relevant official or Competitor to ensure their witnesses are available and able to take part in the hearing.

9.5 Stewards extended powers:

- (1) The Stewards shall have extended powers to deal with any matters that arise in relation to the Championship between Meetings. A Stewards' panel may be convened by MotorSport New Zealand at any time during the Series to consider any protest or other matter within their jurisdiction in relation to the Championship which may be referred to them, or which may be initiated by the Stewards on their own volition.
- (2) When the Stewards have commenced a hearing at one place, and it is deemed by them not practicable to complete consideration of that matter at that time and place, the hearing may be adjourned to another time and place and may be heard by a panel of Stewards other than those who commenced the hearing, provided at least one(1) Steward who was at the original hearing is a member of the new panel. If required, the panel will be appointed by MotorSport New Zealand.
- (3) The Stewards may call upon any witness or advisor they so decide, either as part of, or outside, a hearing to assist in resolution of any matter.
- (4) The Stewards maximum fine level is raised to \$10,000 for any offence. Additionally, they may, for any offence, impose the penalty of exclusion from the Meeting or Event and endorse a Competition Licence for a maximum period of twelve (12) months.
 - (i) If at the conclusion of a hearing the Stewards consider that the matter has been proven and the penalty prescribed in Appendix Two is insufficient given the serious nature of the offence then in such instances the matter may be passed to MotorSport New Zealand for action.

10. INQUIRIES

- 10.1** Inquiries into any part of Practice, Qualifying, or Race may be lodged by the competitor or Team Manager with the Race Director on the race Inquiry form within thirty(30) minutes after the completion of the session concerned.
- 10.2** Each Driver in the Championship has an allowance of three(3) race Inquiries for the duration of the Championship.
 - 10.2.1** Any Inquiry submitted relating to a matter already under investigation by the Race Director will not be accepted.
 - 10.2.2** Any Inquiry submitted which is supported by the Race Director shall not result in a reduction in the Inquiry allowance.
 - 10.2.3** Any Inquiry submitted which is not supported by the Race Director shall result in the loss of one(1) Inquiry from the allowance.
- 10.3** Once a total of three(3) unsupported Inquiries has been reached, the ability to lodge any further Inquiries is no longer available.

- 10.4** All race Inquiry forms must be completed in full with as much detail as possible, including the time the incident occurred or lap number, the location on track, and the race numbers of the competitor/s involved. If this information cannot be provided the Inquiry form will be deemed unsupported.
- 10.5** It is the responsibility of the Race Director or their assistant to give a written reply to the Inquiry form as a matter of urgency.
- 10.6** If the Inquiry results in a Hearing, this may be only attended by the Driver and one(1) team member who is in attendance in a supporting role and can only contribute to the Hearing if asked to by the Race Director.
- 10.7** A Competitor will have the right to protest the written reply to the Inquiry.

11. DRIVER APPAREL

- 11.1** **Driver Apparel:** All Competitors shall wear the following driver safety apparel/equipment when competing within the Category;
- (1)** Protective Helmets, Frontal Head Restraints, and Protective Clothing, in compliance with Schedule A, Part One, Article 4.
 - (2)** Compulsory sponsor badges as will be provided by the Category and must be attached to the competitor's suit as follows:
 - (i)** TGR badge to the front facing outside of the Velcro neck tab of their race suits to be in view at all times when the race suit is closed at the neck (width of logo to be 50mm).
 - (ii)** GR86 Category badges to the upper front chest area on the left side of their race suits (width of logo to be 80mm).

Note: These must be attached in compliance with Schedule A, Article 4.3

- 11.2** Competitors must present their driver safety apparel/equipment to be checked at the first Round they compete at. If a competitor has additional or alternative apparel at subsequent meetings, it must be presented at that meeting for approval.
- 11.2.1** A competitor may not take part in any Championship session using apparel that has not been passed by the meeting Scrutineer(s), or Championship Scrutineer.

12. TYRE TYPE, ALLOCATION, AND MARKING PROCEDURES

- 12.1** Only the control tyres as detailed in Schedule GR86 are authorised for use within the Championship events for all; in season Test days, Practice, Qualifying or Racing.
- 12.2** All tyres will be recorded and use of the tyres will be monitored throughout the Championship.
- 12.3** The maximum number of tyres for the current Championship which includes in-season test days, practice, qualifying and racing is four(4) used tyres and thirty six(36) new tyres.
- (a)** Used championship tyres for the 2025-26 Championship must be used for all practice sessions;
 - (b)** Effective from Round One all competitors must present four(4) new tyres only, to be marked prior to qualifying for use at that round for qualifying and race;

- (c) Supplementary tyres may only be used to replace a damaged tyre where authorised by the Championship Scrutineer. Any supplementary tyres to be introduced must be a previously marked tyre from that competitor's tyre pool (not test tyres); and
- (d) At a competitor's first round practice, a supplementary used test tyre may be authorised by the Championship Scrutineer providing the replacement tyre is of similar condition to the damaged tyre.

12.4 The only Championship tyres permitted to be used are those that have been delivered to the GR86 official tyre marking bay at the allocated time, unless advised by the Championship Scrutineer (detailed on the GR86 Notice Board at each Round of the Championship) for marking tyres. It remains the competitors' obligation;

- (a) To ensure that they manage their tyres in accordance with the maximum numbers specified in 11.4 of these Articles;
- (b) To ensure that all tyres intended for use at any Round are bar coded, marked and recorded to each individual car number, prior to the first Qualifying session and from that time on, only those tyres may be used by the competitor for which they have been marked;
- (c) To ensure that all wheel tyre combinations are cleaned before being submitted for marking; and
- (d) To ensure tyre markings are reinstated by the Championship Scrutineer if they become rubbed or hard to read.

12.5 Specifically prohibited for all test and championship tyres are the following modifications:

- (a) Hand cut tread grooves;
- (b) Filing and buffing;
- (c) Chemical treatments; and
- (d) Any means of artificially enhancing tyre performance.

12.6 Tyre warmers are prohibited.

12.7 Tyres must be fitted to the rim in the correct configuration, as indicated by the manufacturer on the tyre wall.

12.8 All control tyres must be purchased through Race Tyre Services. Test tyres are available to be collected from Race Tyre Services' premises, all race tyres will be supplied and fitted at the track, at each round, by Race Tyre Services.

13. COMPETITOR DATA ACQUISITION SYSTEMS

13.1 All systems of data recording, including cameras, fitted to the car by the Competitor or Entrant shall be made available, upon request by the Race Director, Clerk of the Course or MotorSport New Zealand in a format acceptable to the Officials. Competitors are required to save a copy of all the data from the Event without modifying or deleting the data until fourteen(14) days after the finish of the Event.

13.2 Data from the fastest car (fastest car is as recorded by the official event timing system), will be made available to all Category competitors after each test session, practice session, qualifying session, and race.

14. ON BOARD/JUDICIAL CAMERAS AND TELEVISION

14.1 Camera Installation: Cameras must be installed in accordance with these articles and be approved by the Championship Scrutineer.

14.2 Camera Purpose: During test days, practice, qualifying and races all cars shall carry the TGRNZ “as supplied” camera. This camera is installed on all cars to provide;

- (a) The nominated film production company with high quality images;
- (b) Competitors with greater detail of their cars performance when studying data recorded; and
- (c) On request from the Race Director and/or the Driving Standards Observer, the Clerk of the Course or Stewards of the Meeting, relevant footage to assist in judicial investigations must be made available. Such recordings shall be retained and unmodified in any way for a minimum of fourteen(14) days after the conclusion of the event.

14.3 Camera Operation Procedures:

- (a) **Practice Sessions, Qualifying and Races:** The TGRNZ official assigned to oversee the cameras will insert a TGRNZ ‘as supplied’ memory card marked ‘Car and Card No’ into the camera prior to the session commencement. It is the responsibility of the team to immediately advise the TGRNZ official if there are any problems that could affect the camera from recording.
- (b) **Replacement memory card:** If your memory card is required for judicial purposes by the Clerk of the Course, Race Director, Driving Standards Observer or Stewards of the Meeting then a duly marked replacement card will be installed and sealed.
- (c) **Lost memory cards:** The onus remains with the competitor to immediately contact the TGRNZ official should one of the allocated memory cards be lost. TGRNZ will issue a further card at the competitors’ expense.

14.4 Footage rights and obligations: Any footage gained from the camera shall be made available by TGRNZ to the event officials (on request for footage) and to the nominated film production company before the conclusion of the meeting. Teams/entrants are reminded that all footage obtained remains the property of Toyota New Zealand and for the avoidance of doubt, without prior permission from TGRNZ you may not use any footage obtained for any commercial purposes including but not limited to any form of television broadcast (free to air, internet, pay per view, subscription, terrestrial, satellite), any other form of internet use, any advertising, sponsorship promotion or for any type of public performance – paying or otherwise.

14.5 Camera penalties: The Race Director reserves the right to impose a penalty should the camera:

- (a) Not be switched on;
- (b) Memory card found to have been tampered with / swapped or taken out;
- (c) Footage has been used for one or more of the commercial purposes detailed in Article 13.4 above, without prior permission from TGRNZ;
- (d) The camera has been deliberately damaged.

14.6 Additional Cameras: Additional cameras are permitted during Practice session(s) only:

- (a) The sole purpose is to provide Competitors with greater detail of their performance;
- (b) The camera installation must be approved by the Championship Scrutineer;

- (c) Any other use of the video footage is not permitted without prior approval from TGRNZ.

14.7 Any on board footage from Qualifying, or races will not be released to the teams or driver's representatives until permission has been given by the Race Director.

14.8 Access to Television Outside Broadcast Facility and footage: No Entrant, Driver or team member shall be permitted to access the television 'Outside Broadcasting' facility or gain access to any footage directly from the broadcaster during an Event, without obtaining the express permission of the Race Director or the Chairman of Stewarding Panel.

15.2 To award the overall Round winners, points for all races will be added together. In the event of a tie then the provision of Article 11.6 in Schedule Z will be used. If this does not separate the Competitors, then grid positions for Race One will be used to break the tie.

16. PRESENTATIONS & AWARDS

16.1 At the Annual MotorSport New Zealand Awards Function the overall winner will be awarded the GR86 Championship Trophy.

Note: The GR86 Championship Trophy will be presented first for promotional purposes at the GR86 Awards Function which takes place after the final Round of the Championship. The venue and date for this function to be confirmed.

16.2 The following additional award will be presented at the GR86 Awards Function:

- (a) The title of 86 Rookie of the Year will be awarded to the driver with highest overall points.

Note: A rookie is defined as a driver who has competed in no more than two (2) rounds of any previous Toyota 86 Championship or competed in no more than two (2) rounds of any equivalent or higher-level category within the last 12 months. A driver must also be 25 years of age or younger, as at 1st November 2025. TOYOTA GAZOO Racing NZ reserves the right to approve eligibility. The intention is that this trophy will be awarded to a driver of limited relevant experience at this level of motorsport.

- (b) The title of GR86 Master Class Winner will be awarded to the driver with highest overall points. To be eligible for this award a driver must be 35 years of age or over as at 1st November 2025. For this title to be awarded, a minimum of three(3) qualifying drivers must be entered in the Championship.

Note: TGRNZ reserves the right to add further trophies and/or awards to the above schedule.
