

## MOTORSPORT NEW ZEALAND ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY

The objective of this Policy is to affirm and document MotorSport New Zealand's commitment to considering and managing environmental and sustainability issues. Overall, MotorSport New Zealand commits to reducing, preventing or eliminating the environmental hazards and impacts of its people, activities, operations, and products.

This Policy applies to MotorSport New Zealand Board Members, management, staff, officials and volunteers.

**Vision:** "To foster sustainability in motorsport in New Zealand"

### MotorSport New Zealand will:

- Ensures that its Management and Staff accept responsibility for environmental issues that have the potential to impact on the organisations standing in the community
- Comply with all relevant legislation requirements relating to environment protection and management
- Be open and transparent about its environmental performance
- Promote the efficient use of resources, minimisation of waste and prevention of pollution on all its operations
- Avoid actions that risk having significant adverse impacts on biodiversity cultural and/or heritage assets or values
- Actively encourage its employees, Member clubs, contractors, competitors, volunteers and suppliers to understand their responsibility to minimise potential risks to the environment
- Continually monitor and strive to improve its environmental management performance
- Promote and encourage investment into sustainability programmes to increase biodiversity within the communities that motorsport operates in

### MotorSport New Zealand's Environmental Objectives and Targets are:

- To continue its policy of correct separation and disposal of recyclable waste and increase the proportion of its waste as recycled waste by a further 5% annually
- To continually monitor energy usage and consider ways of reducing energy usage
- To continue to work towards further reduction in the usage of paper annually
- To encourage MotorSport New Zealand Member Clubs to adopt MotorSport New Zealand's Environmental Sustainability Policy

- To by the end of 2022, be able to calculate our operational Carbon Footprint
- To by the end of 2024, have completed environmental training for all of our member clubs and employees to ensure that all stakeholders understand their responsibility to minimise potential risk to the environment
- As an organisation, achieve a FIA 3-Star Accreditation by the end of 2024
