

There will be five lights illuminated in sequence. Once all five lights are illuminated they will be extinguished to indicate the Start.





ROLLING START EXAMPLE

ROLLING START BY LIGHTS Schedule Z, Article 8.4

After the Positioning Lap has been completed all vehicles assemble on the grid.

When race control is satisfied the pole vehicle is in the allocated position the green lights will illuminate and the field will be directed away for the Formation Lap behind the Safety Car.



All vehicles must maintain their grid positions and keep up with the Safety Car.

On approach to the start line, the Safety Car will turn off its flashing lights and enter Pit Lane.

The field will then maintain a grid position of being alongside the vehicle on the same row with a gap of no more than three (3) vehicle lengths to the vehicle immediately in front or the row ahead if no vehicle is occupying that position.

A constant speed between 75-85 km/h set by the vehicle on pole position must be maintained until the signal to Start is given.

The red light(s) will be illuminated when the vehicles approach the start line.



The red light(s) will be extinguished to indicate a Start.
